Alas, the time has come for me to bid thee farewell as President of the TPCA. This year has been an adventure with a few dark patches and many bright ones. As we reflect on the year, the Board has made significant progress in the way our association is managed and the current state of the organization.

As a Board, we had the choice to do the "right things right", the "right things wrong", the "wrong things right" and the "wrong things wrong". I am pleased to state that the Board and our KA Diehl management staff focused on doing "the right things right".

We have reviewed and revised the governance documents including policies, procedures, rules & regulations and standing committee terms of references. We established an annual review process for these documents to help ensure that these important documents stay current to the CCRs and By-laws. We developed and approved new Association policies including:

- Approval of Contracts
- Procurement
- Election of Board of Directors
- Association Bank Account
- Code of Ethics for Board of Directors

We took our fiduciary responsibilities very seriously and are pleased to advise you of the following:

- Stayed within our 2012 budget using a conservative approach to our spending.
- Reduced our owner delinquent accounts by 42% including \$21,000 in bad debt write-offs
- Revised our investment policy to be more conservative to meet the current economic climate

We addressed projects that affect the overall appearance of our community. The Courtyard Park wall project was completed earlier in the summer. Most recently, we have focused on the "Sprucing-up of Tidewater". This project is a joint effort of our owners, our Community Manager and staff and the Phoenix Landscaping team. The work is ongoing and these improvements will continue into the fall.

We heard you when you requested user-friendly access to your account information, association financials, governance documents, meeting minutes, forms, contact information, DRB standards, etc. We are pleased to inform you that these items are now available via the KA Diehl website (www.KADIEHL.com). More items are being added as needed. The TPCA website is also being updated during the coming

months. We are in the process of implementing a new electronic tool that will allow you to register your guests via a web-site and change personal data in our Community Information System (CIS).

Our most recent accomplishment was a joint effort of the Security Committee, our Board and our Community Manager. We are pleased to have the Universal Protection Service group joining our community to provide us with security services. The transition plan is in process and the official transition date is October 1. Universal Pro is a US- owned company that provides security services for communities in the Myrtle Beach and Wilmington areas. They have over 3500 employees nationwide. Please join us in welcoming the Universal Pro team to our community.

Board Notes

The September 06, 2012 Board Meeting addressed actions taken since the last meeting, TPCA financials and association policies. At the start of the meeting, your Board thanked Brenda Muldrow for her service and leadership during the last year, citing some of the very difficult challenges that were met during her tenure as President.

Actions since the last Board Meeting:

Instead of meeting monthly, your Board is now meeting every two months. However, the work of managing the property doesn't stop. As required by the TPCA policies, all actions taken outside the formal meetings or in executive session are

reported in the next formal meeting to the members. The follow actions were taken and reported upon.

On **July 25th**, your Board voted via e-mail to accept and approve Vereen's Concrete proposal to make repairs to the catch basins for a cost not to exceed \$16,325 from the Reserves.

On **August 30, 2012**, at the Board Workshop your Board voted to approve the Recreation Committee's request for a Poker Run event on September 15, 2012.

On **August 30, 2012**, your Board voted to approve funds for the Common Areas Spruce-Up Projects with the funds coming from the unused 2012 landscaping budget in the amount of \$36,000, the 2012 Special Project Common Area Maintenance funds in the amount of \$3000 and the 2012 Unidentified Special Project funds in the amount of \$1,798 for a total not to exceed \$40,798.00.

On **August 31, 2012**, the Board approved via email the recommendation by the Security vendor taskforce (3 security committee members and 3 Board members) to select Universal Protection Service as our security vendor. A Letter of Intent has been signed and a two-year contract is in negotiations at this time.

On **September 6, 2012**, the Board upheld a decision made by the DRB to have a homeowner remove the non-conforming raised edging.

Financials

Your Board voted to approve the July financials subject to audit.

Association Policies

The Board is required to review each policy on its anniversary date. Many policies were reviewed and approved with no change. The Investment Policy was changed to tighten the criteria for purchase to require both notes and bonds to be rated at least A3 or A- by both Moody's and Standard and Poor's. The Towing Policy was modified to require the Security Officers to contact, by phone, any owner whose car is on the street after 10 pm, with some follow up calls. If despite these actions, the car remains in the street after midnight it will be towed. (Note that this is a summary and owners should refer to the policy on the TPCA web site or in the Information Room.)

Insurance Renewal

Your Board approved the renewal of the flood policy covering

the Beach Cabana with Nationwide Insurance. The policy covers \$311,300 for the building and \$79,000 in contents for a premium amount of \$5,334.

These notes are not intended to be a complete and full record of the actions of the referenced Board meeting. Any owner wishing such information should obtain the approved minutes from the Information Room in the TPCA building or from the TPCA web site.

Tidewater Sprucing Up

I thought I'd bring everyone up to date on where we are on these projects.

Lot Cleaning – There are 143 vacant lots in Tidewater and 30 of them were in a satisfactorily maintained condition. I originally thought there were 145 but two were actually combined with other lots and I couldn't tell by looking at them. More than half of them have been done and I did extend the due date on about 5 or 6 until January to accommodate owner's requests. The last two weeks have been very busy as I'm sure you've all seen the clean-ups in progress. The deadline is September 28th.

Common Areas – Over \$40,000.00 in common area beautification projects have been approved by the Board. About 10% of that occurred in the last week of August and first week of September in time for the TCTC. The remainder will start in the first week of October, weather permitting, and should be complete by the end of October. In addition, the Board approved the acceleration of about \$11,000 of 2013 planned Special Projects to be completed in 2012. These included lighting at the Plantation and Bluffs entrances.

Golf Course and Clubhouse – Again, a lot of beautification projects around the clubhouse area were completed by Southern Land and Golf in time for the TCTC Tournament. Others will be continuing.

Roadway Right of Way – Sixty seven letters were sent to homeowners whose roadway landscaping was deficient. Many are working on them or have already completed them. Their deadline is in October.

Design Review Board

The Design Review Board (DRB) met on August 20, 2012 with Paul Blust, Zoning Administrator for the City of North Myrtle Beach, to discuss the City's Tree Protection Ordinance which was passed in 2004.

Aspects of the ordinance which will affect Tidewater residents are as follows:

- trees 16" caliper/diameter measurement and above, measured 3 ft. from the ground, must have a permit from the City for removal
- trees over 24" caliper/diameter measurement, measured 3 ft. from the ground, must be approved for removal by the City Board of Zoning Appeals
- all pine trees are exempt from the City tree protection ordinance
- for multi-trunk trees, the caliper/diameter measurement is taken 3 ft. from the ground and is a combined total of the caliper/diameter measurements of the two largest trunks
- if a tree is required to be replaced, the caliper/diameter measurement of the new tree must be one half the caliper/diameter measurement of the removed tree providing a permit for removal has been issued by the City
- if a tree is removed without the required permit from the City, the replacement tree must be twice the caliper/diameter measurement of the removed tree
- if it is determined that a property is sufficiently treed, the property owner will be required to pay an amount to the City tree fund which is calculated at \$100 per inch for every inch caliper/diameter measurement of the removed tree. For a 17 inch tree, the payment to the City tree fund would be \$1700.00. This payment is required regardless of the reason for removal, including natural demise, disease or damage to the subject tree.
- On new construction, any tree within the footprint of the house may be removed without a City permit.

The Tidewater Tree Removal Policy is still in effect. The removal of any tree requires the approval of the Design Review Board. If the DRB determines that a tree does not warrant removal, the City will not override the DRB decision. Property owners may still consult a certified arborist to appeal a DRB decision regarding the removal of a tree.

As we are in the midst of hurricane season, the DRB would like to remind homeowners that not every tree poses a threat to property in the event of a storm, including pine trees. The following are excerpts from a Policy Statement issued by the DRB in 1998 regarding the removal of trees:

Hurricanes are acts of God that we cannot plan for or predict, and they should not cause us to change or alter the very things that have been essential in creating our community environment. The natural beauty of Tidewater has always been without question the number one attraction and amenity at Tidewater. It has been the single most referenced quality that sets Tidewater

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apart from the often-barren landscape of other coastal communities. The tall over story of the pine forest that dominates our landscape is a critical element in the long-term stability of that landscape.

- From an ecological standpoint, the pine forest plays an essential role in the protection of our other large beautiful hardwoods (oaks, elms, maples and the like). In severe wind conditions the tall pines create a windbreak, protecting the shallower root systems of the hardwoods located beneath them. Without the pines and this windbreak, these grand hardwoods would be far more susceptible to blowing over in such storms.
- The over story created by the pines creates a productive habitat for the smaller hardwoods to thrive, such as dogwoods, sweet gums, etc. Without this over story, their continued existence and procreation would be threatened.
- From an architectural prospective at Tidewater, the vertical massing of our structures has always been the primary concern. The tall pines help keep the vertical elements of our structures "in scale" and prevent structures from becoming the dominant element. Replacing these massive pines with smaller trees that will never achieve the same height and scale cannot duplicate this effect.

The DRB is responsible for the approval of the removal of trees in Tidewater. We do not take this responsibility lightly. We will give serious consideration and generally will issue approval for removal of trees that are damaged, severely leaning toward structures or otherwise posing an immediate threat to a structure. We will not, however, issue approval for the removal of trees that are healthy and do not pose any immediate threat. In those incidences where we issue approval for removal of trees, we also require the planting of new trees in order to begin the all important reforestation process.

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


